

# Russell Everett

The most natural way to introduce Russell Everett is as a celebrated artist and an accomplished teacher. Russell received his B.F.A. and M.F.A. degrees and went on to hold various teaching positions starting in Ozark, Alabama as an Artist in Residence in the public schools. He has worked with the Montgomery Museum of Fine Arts as a drawing and watercolor instructor and has juried and given demonstrations at various Fountain City Arts Festivals in Prattville, Alabama. Russell was an Artist in Residence at AIDB for four years, taught with the Arts Enrichment Program in the Talladega School System, worked for a year as an assistant with the Heritage Hall Museum, and also taught with Summer Art Camps in Talladega for five years. He has exhibited in more than forty art competitions and invitational exhibitions over the past decade and his work is owned by various museums and universities.

Russell has been a Lecturer in The Art and Design Department at Troy University for the past ten years. He just received his 'Ten years of service' pin and worked as an adjunct for several years prior to his appointment as a Lecturer. He has also taught as an adjunct at Troy Montgomery for the past fifteen years. While Russell teaches Visual Arts, Watercolor, and Sculpture at the main campus, his forte is Introductory Drawing. Recently, Russell had drawings on display in the Faculty Show, Past and Present, at the new Troy International Arts Center.
